General Manager Report

Dear Residents,

Welcome to the October edition of the Breakfast Pointer and welcome to Spring! It has been lovely to see the gardens waking up from winter - a spectacular time of the year here in Breakfast Point.

Green Options has entered Breakfast Point into the National Landscape Excellence Awards that are run by The Landscape Association. The Landscape Excellence Awards are a significant opportunity for the industry to showcase their outstanding levels of complexity, quality of workmanship, management prowess, innovation, and creativity to the wider community. Judging is currently underway - fingers crossed that our entry is successful.

The end of financial year has wrapped up at the end of August, and overall, I am happy with the end result. ASSOCIATION COMMITTEE ROUND UP

Lap Pool

As you may know the Lap Pool renovation has been going since May. Many people have asked why it has taken so long. The renovation of the pool is more than just the removal of the old paint and tiles and a new paint. The pool is over 16 years old, so pressure testing was conducted of the pipework and the pools earthing also checked. The expansion joint was also removed and replaced. The pool coping tiles have also been removed and will be replaced, as has the pool lighting.

The pool was inspected for cracking and the pool render checked. Areas were found to be drummy, cracked and in some areas the render had become powdery. As a result, areas of render were removed, replaced, and the whole pool sand blasted.

The steps were cut down to a uniform size to improve access, and on doing so large holes were found, they were holding water and had no steel reinforcement. The stairs have now been reinforced and repaired. Reinforcement was also required around the 8 skimmer boxes.

Tiling is underway and once complete, the epoxy needs a coat to be applied in 24 or 48 hour intervals over 6 consecutive coats. It then requires 2 to 3 weeks curing. Unfortunately, the delivery timeframe has extended out due to various factors, however it is important that all preparation and the work is completed as per the engineers and product manufacturers specifications to ensure longevity of the pool and that owners are getting a quality product for their levies.

The new completion date is now the 16th of November.

Dogs Off Leash

A reminder that Canada Bay rangers have authority to issue fines in Breakfast Point regarding dogs off leash. They regularly visit BP and issue fines of \$220. Breakfast Point has a Community Management Statement prohibiting Dogs Off Leash (By-Law 67) as well as adherence to the Companion Animal Act (1998).

There have been a number of incidents where residents have encountered dogs off leash and there has been a safety issue and/or an altercation with the owner. We have a lot of people who enjoy the foreshore walk and families who like to take their children to play on the Village Green so when you take your dog for an enjoyable walk, please think of others and potential risks if your dog is not on a leash.

Lagoon Pool Landscaping

The Lagoon Pool Landscaping renewal works were completed in September. The works include new softfall and kwik kerb edge, steel garden edging, new bollard and up lighting, pathway extension, garden planting and mulching as well as the installation of new shade tolerant turf.



Spa Repairs

The spa has been tested for leaks, of which 3 were found in the exterior pipework. These have now been repaired and pressure tested. The missing mosaic tiles have been replaced and the spa re-grouted and lights and coping tiles replaced. A new spa heater has also been installed and will be commissioned once the spa can be filled with water.

Budget 2023-2024

The AC has been extremely busy working with the Finance Committee and Community Association representatives to prepare a final budget for the next twelve months. CA reps have been to two meetings where there have been open discussions and Q & A sessions to better inform them of the proposals and the justification.

Another meeting is planned to finalise the budget with CA reps prior to the AGM on the 20th November. The discussions have been well received and have answered many questions from Strata committees.

Aeration Works -Village Green

The Village Green has an extremely thick thatch that has resulted in poor drainage and poor grass health. It is not known if the grass has ever been scarified or aerated since it was built. The proposed aeration works will remove the thatch, aerate the soil and then the lawn will be top dressed and fertilised to improve the drainage, health and growth of the grass.

The works are planned to occur over summer (optimum time for grass growth) after the Community Christmas Carols have been held. Works will take approximately one week and will commence on the 4th of December. The grass will be scarified, vertical drain aeration and then fertilising and top dressing. As a result the oval will be sandy and look a little sparse for some time.



Granite Pathway -Lower Foreshore

The granite pathway on the lower foreshore has had renovation works with the replacement of missing or broken edging and the renewal and compaction of the granite surface. The section around the point has not been completed as the granite pathway and gardens are planned to be removed and replaced with a more suitable surface and some seating.

It was in early 2007 when Ashley Quinn received a call from a friend at Macquarie Bank. They had decided they were going to form a Residential Property Fund that they would float on the stock market. Basically they wanted to buy in a range of quality off plan developments across Sydney and eventually interstate. After a couple of months of haggling, Macquarie Bank became the largest buyer in Breakfast Point history, purchasing almost 100 apartments across Chateaux, Mornington, Burgundy Hill & Observatory Hill. Then about 6 months later the GFC hit. The idea behind floating the residential property fund became impossible. To their credit they settled every apartment and then quickly on sold them all. Breakfast Point was the only development that they not only didn't lose money, but actually made a small profit.

This wasn't the only impact of the GFC. What happened was basically overnight BP's bread & butter buyer, the downsizing baby boomer who wanted a 3 bedroom apartment had disappeared from the market place. And Rose had hundreds more 3 bedders planned. Something had to change quickly to attract a younger buyer. That plan was to greatly reduce the

number of 3 bedroom apartments, increase the number of 2 bedroom and add a larger proportion of 1 bedroom properties.



This grew the existing dwelling numbers from 1865 to around 2100.

The biggest change was to the Plantations precinct. What people didn't see was the original design for this precinct, a scheme that was first envisaged during the boom times of 2003. There was to be a manmade lake in the middle, surrounded by apartments where the courtyard designs had timber decks cantilevering over the water. The construction costs were absorbent and the question was how much a buyer would pay to look over a manmade lake. In these new times it didn't stack up and scrapped for a more conventional scheme. If it was built I would have hated to see the precinct contributions to maintain a lake.

It was a plan that worked. Whilst many developers hit the wall, Breakfast Point pushed through to better times.....
